



# Standardized Dress Policy Elementary Grades 1-6

All clothes must fit appropriately and be worn with appropriate undergarments as deemed fit by the campus administration. Campus administration will have complete and final judgment on all matters concerning interpretation of the student dress code.

## Girls

### Tops:

- Shirts may be polo style or button up.
- Shirts must be collared and free of any design or logo except approved Ennis Logo
- Shirts must be long enough to cover the stomach and back when arms are raised and when seated.
- Sweatshirts, turtlenecks, and sweaters may be worn if free of any design or logo except approved Ennis logo.
- All tops (including garments worn under or over tops) must be solid white, maroon, navy blue, black or gray.

### Bottoms:

- Pants, shorts, capris, or skirts may be worn.
- Leggings or tights in approved standard dress colors may be worn under pants, shorts, capris, or skirts.
- Shorts at EIS must have at least a three inch inseam.
- Skirts at EIS must be at least fingertip length.
- Colors must be solid: tan, khaki, black, navy blue, brown, or gray.
- No denim, dungaree or blue jean type materials may be worn.

### Dresses:

- Jumpers may be worn with an appropriate top from above.
- Jumpers at EIS must be fingertip length.
- Colors must be solid: tan, khaki, black, navy blue, brown, or gray.
- No denim, dungaree or blue jean type materials may be worn.

## Boys

### Tops:

- Shirts may be polo style or button up.
- Shirts must be collared with sleeves and free of any design or logo except approved Ennis logo.
- Sweatshirts, turtlenecks, and sweaters may be worn if free of any design or logo except approved Ennis logo.
- All tops (including garments worn under or over tops) must be solid white, maroon, navy blue, black or gray.

### Bottoms:

- Pants or shorts may be worn.
- All pants or shorts must be solid tan, khaki, black, navy blue, brown, or gray
- No denim, dungaree or blue jean type materials may be worn.
- Sagging pants or shorts are not permitted.

## Boys & Girls

### Shoes:

- No flip flops (V-strip through toe) may be worn.

### Belts:

- Optional for grades 1-6.

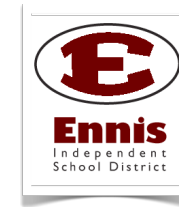
### Jackets:

- No denim, dungaree or blue jean type materials may be worn.

\*\*\*\* If a jacket, sweater, or any other garment is going to be worn all day in the classroom, it must be in one of the approved standard dress colors.

### Spirit Day:

- Students may wear jeans with a regular dress code shirt or an Ennis Spirit T-shirt on Fridays. Jeans must be neatly hemmed, have no holes, and be free of design, logos, or embroidery.
