



Press Release from the Ennis Independent School District

On April 23rd, the Ennis ISD Board of Trustees voted unanimously to name Jay Tullos the lone finalist for the district's superintendent position.

Mr. Tullos has been serving as superintendent for the Canton Independent School District since 2010. Prior to this, he served as superintendent for five years with the Douglass Independent School District.

The state requires a 21-day waiting period, after which trustees are expected to offer Mr. Tullos a contract for employment.

"My family and I are excited about the opportunity to join Ennis ISD. I look forward to working with the staff and community in continuing to prepare our students for success not only in the classroom but in life," said Tullos in a statement issued after being named the lone finalist.

Tullos has previously been nominated for the Region 10 Superintendent of the Year, served on the Commissioner's Cabinet for the Texas Commissioner of Education, and has been a member of the Region 10 Advisory Committee.

EISD Board President Bramlet Beard said the search for a new superintendent "has been long, but very necessary." He continued, "In a superintendent search, there are numerous, very well-qualified candidates to consider. The board has spent countless hours researching and interviewing many of these with the ultimate goal of finding the one candidate that would best fit our district and the community. We definitely feel that we have found this in Jay Tullos."

Beard added, "On behalf of the EISD Board of Trustees, I want to say that we are thankful to all of the candidates who were interested in our district. It has given us much to think about as well as much to take pride in. We understand that this is a major decision, and we have placed great significance on a choice that we feel will continue taking us from where we are to where we want to be."
