I. Call to Order

A. The regular meeting of the District-wide Educational Improvement Council (DWC) was called to order at 12:00 pm on July 26, 2021 by Superintendent Jay Tullos.

II. Review 2021-2022 District Improvement Plan/ Campus Improvement Plan

A. Wade Bishop presented the 2021-2022 District Improvement Plan which consists of 6 long term goals. The goals are:

1. To Ensure all students receive high- quality education.
2. Provide and support high-quality staff for all classrooms.
3. Empower staff with resources to ensure student excellence.
4. Provide a safe and secure learning environment, cultivating character and high expectations.
5. Maintain a positive two-way partnership designed to strengthen the strategies aligned to the district vision and continuously improve teacher effectiveness and student outcomes.
6. Maintain high-quality facilities with an instructional focus.

B. Wade Bishop presented the Districts Needs Assessment which included Demographics, Student Learning, District Processes and Programs, and Perceptions.

1. District strategies that will be put in place to meet the goals are the implementation of the new program “Lion Pride Way”, expansion of the Dual Language program, Social and Emotional learning, and Summer School opportunities.
 2. Campus strategies that will be put in place to meet the goals were also discussed.

 - A. A Student Leadership Program that will be a common language. This will be implemented throughout the district.
 - IV. Update on Alamo and Transportation Building Projects
 - A. The Alamo wing has been renovated. There are 19 classrooms and a few of the rooms will be used during In-Service days.
 - B. The new Transportation facility will be built by the existing Jr. High. The goal is to have this facility ready for the 2022-2023 school year.
