We discussed each strategy under each goal:

<u>Goal #1:</u>

- Reading Interventionists are working hard. 18 of their students are back in the classroom. They are starting to work with PreK students. Considerable
- We provided Christmas gifts for 13 families of students. Backpacks with food go home weekly for those in need. Coat drive was held and teachers purchased items for kids. Considerable
- Data is looked at and teaching is adjusted. Data sheets are used to keep track of student progress. Considerable
- Activities are developmentally appropriate and we follow PK guidelines and Kinder TEKS. Some teachers document in their lesson plans.
- CLI assessment wave 2 is finished on Feb. 7 for PK. one more wave. Considerable.
- SPED gives Brigance assessment to see what developmental level they are on to show progress. Considerable
- 14% of students are below grade level in Kinder. 81% passing on second math test in kinder. Considerable
- Perfect attendance: Mrs. Martinez PK class won last 9 weeks and went to Chiliś. 77% school wide attendance 2nd 9 weeks. Sickness has been going around.

- Before and after school time: we need more staff to help keep kids in the computer lab to get more time on Lexia or Dreambox. Some teachers allow students in the classroom to work on the computer. Discontinued
- Field trips: Kinder went to Mainstays farm in Cleburne and PK is going to Mayborne museum in April. In town field trip needs to be scheduled. Considerable
- Writers workshop in Kinder going on. Next unit starts soon. Considerable

Goal #2:

- Professional Development: Nov. 11 teachers were given a choice board for learning. Considerable
- Highly qualified staff. 2 bilingual teachers need to pass a bilingual test. Considerable
- Staff are appreciated by given lunch, notes, treats, etc. Carlee Fincher was teacher of 2nd 9 weeks. Considerable

Goal #3:

- In the process of taking needs requests from teachers and ordering supplies as needed. Some progress
- Communicated through: PLC meetings are held weekly, team leaders, site based team, and other committees are used to make decisions. Considerable
- 93% of students are meeting usage on Lexia computer program. Dreambox average 5 lessons a week. Considerable
- Children are getting better at using new technology and logging into required programs. Considerable
- PTO is spending money to order teacher wish lists. Chilis \$50 in Nov and Dec. Waiting on McDonalds check. Considerable

Goal #4:

- Transition field trip has not been scheduled yet.
- Acts of kindness with legend oaks nursing home: kids sang at Christmas, canned food and gloves were collected. Considerable
- Positive behavior is encouraged through PBIS.
- Fire drills and duck and cover drills held. We will continue doing them in the spring. Considerable
- Mrs. Ginger has classes weekly in her office to teach about germ spreading prevention. She is adding information on Facebook as week. Car seat safety needs to be addressed. Considerable
- Have not had parent trainings since Oct. 15

- Reading night has 373 visitors and was a huge hit! Considerable
- Parents were invited to many events: Thanksgiving programs, PK feasts, Christmas parties. Considerable
- Kids Night Out held Jan. 31... We expect to have a huge turnout. Some progress
- We continue to use newsletters, peach jar, face to face, texting, remind, etc to communicate to families. Considerable
